

Job Retention & Career Advancement Resources for Rehabilitation Professionals

Many factors make it difficult for people with vision loss to retain and advance in their careers. Because WIOA stresses the importance of career advancement and job retention, rehabilitation professionals have a heightened responsibility to aid their consumers in these efforts. This sheet is a collection of NRTC resources for professionals and for persons with vision loss that address common challenges to career advancement and job retention. These challenges include limited professional knowledge about working with vision loss, little knowledge about the skills needed and resources available to help retain a job after experiencing vision loss, and limited job search skills to advance to a new position.
